

Richland County 4-H Code of Conduct

Membership in the Richland County 4-H program is open to any individual, regardless of race, creed, color, sex or national origin. However, membership and participation are privileges, not rights, subject to certain guidelines adopted by the organization.

While participating in any 4-H sponsored activities, including but not limited to club meetings, county fair, state congress, exchange trips, and competitive events, individuals will be expected to exhibit their best behavior. This includes being pleasant and cooperative and being respectful to those in supervisory roles. Also, to show respect for the property of others, facilities, and natural surroundings.

Any individual who violates these expectations will be immediately dismissed from the event or activity by the person/persons in supervisory roles. Persons denied participation in 4-H activities may appeal the decision by submitting a written request for reconsideration with the County Extension Agent within 10 days of the disciplinary action. They then have the right to appear before the county grievance committee, which shall be the 4-H Executive Council, to determine what, if any, additional disciplinary measures are warranted.
